1. CALL TO ORDER

Comm. Ausburn led the Pledge to the American Flag.

4. PUBLIC HEARINGS:

a. Z-22-10 Doug & Tari Anderson of 221 Garrison Shoals Rd to rezone property from ARR (Agriculture Rural Residential) to C2 (General Commercial). Property identified as Map and Parcel B07045A consisting of 2 acres to be used for Sale of Used Cars.

Ch. Turk stated that he met with Mr. Anderson yesterday and Mr. Anderson has asked for the application to be withdrawn.

5. CURRENT BUSINESS:

a. Public Utilities: Banks County Veterinarian Clinic Water Line

Horace Gee Public Utilities Director stated that the Veterinarian Clinic had contacted him about extending water down Webbs Creek Road to the business. He stated the vet clinic had received a bid to extend public water to the development. Mr. Gee stated this waterline was requirement for a commercial business.

He stated the bid the business received was for a 6" line and 2 fire hydrants and the total cost of the bid was \$62,884 which was about 15% less than what he expected. He further stated the County cost share would be \$31,442. The facility would use about 77,000 gallons of water per month and this would take approximately 5 years to recover the cost of the project. The developer would also be required to install a 2" meter and that cost would be \$10,000 so when you include the cost of the 2" meter to the amount of recovering funds, it would only take 2 years to recover the cost of installation.

Comm. Garrison asked if the County had ever invested county money for any other private business? Mr. Gee stated that years ago the County fully financed the water installation to The Pottery.

Comm. Ausburn asked who maintained the water line? Mr. Gee stated that once any line was connected into the County system, the County maintained it.

Comm. Gardiner asked how much it would cost to drill under 441? Mr. Gee stated it would cost approximately \$90,000.

Comm. Ausburn stated he was concerned with running a waterline to a personnel business.

Comm. Garrison said in turn we would be getting property tax revenue that we haven't gotten in the past.

Comm. Ausburn stated so if the County didn't run the waterline to the business, then the business wouldn't locate in Banks County?

Comm. Garrison asked about having an agreement with the vet clinic for the County to take stray animals?

Comm. Ausburn stated we needed to have that agreement in writing.

Mr. Gee stated he was asking for the County to partner with the developer in this project.

Ch. Turk said we would also have to have a 20 ft. easement.

Motion to proceed with the waterline installation pending a 20 ft. easement and an agreement with the vet clinic concerning animal control. Both documents pending board approval and county attorney approval.
