#### 1. CALL TO ORDER

# 1. Contingency

Chairman Griffith asked about the overtime. Mr. Failyer stated this was in a catch-up situation if A/P needs additional time.

Remove \$1,000 Professional Fees.

Audit Fees will be for the whole budget for every department. Chairman stated this would be easier to account for in the whole budget.

Add \$500 to Vehicles/Equipment.

## 3. Technology Thomas Smallwood, TKSmallwood LLC

- Mr. Smallwood stated the need to upgrade the Tax Commissioners server due to it being 2008. He said he would prefer a cloud-based platform.
- He stated the need to upgrade the email platform to Microsoft 365 to include 155 users at approximately \$1,500.

## 4. Human Resources Arlene Ivey

- Ms. Ivey stated the HR Generalist would be receiving certification in November 2026
- She stated there was a spike in the workers comp doe to the new Wastewater Treatment Plant but it still has not come online to date.
- Professional Fees: For Manual updates
- Employee Assistance: Decrease from \$7,000 to \$5,500
- Ms. Ivey requested \$30,000 for an employee pay study

#### 5. Tax Commissioner Becky Carlan

- Professional Fees: Personal property appraisals running late causing a spike in year to date
- Need to replace 2 computers \$1,800
- Need 2 cameras \$200

### 5. Hotel/Motel Extended Stay Harry Patel/Sonya Sewell of Solvue Hospitality

Ms. Sewell stated they represented Solvue Hospitality which included hotels in Banks County as follows:

Quality Inn

Spark by Hilton

**Baymont Inn** 

Red Roof Inn

Mr. Patel stated a good way to insure quality construction of an extended stay hotel is to require concrete and steel construction which drives the construction price up and discourages cheap construction. He also stated conference space with banquet space would be an advantage to the county. He stated kitchenettes were a safety precaution.

Commissioner Ausburn stressed it would still only be up to 29 days – extended stay

Ms. Sewell encouraged event space with a minimum amount of rooms.

Mr. Patel stated due to the price of approximately \$25 million they would only build one hotel every 5 to 10 years.
